the trip

From the vast dunes of the Namibian desert, to the teeming animal life of Etosha, this itinerary traverses the greatest parks, rivers and landscapes that Africa's south has to offer. Beginning in Victoria Falls Zimbabwe we head into Botswana for unforgettable wildlife encounters in two of Africa's greatest sanctuaries along the Chobe River and in the wondrous Okavango Delta. Passing into Namibia, we observe wildlife in Etosha National Park and marvel at the vast Namib Desert and Fish River Canyon. We travel into South Africa to the starkly beautiful Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park, and also witness the Orange River plummet 56m over Augrabies Falls. The city of Cape Town with Table Mountain as its backdrop, is a fitting end to this amazing journey through southern Africa. Staying in a combination of small hotels, safari lodges and guesthouses full of character (and with ensuite facilities), this journey will appeal to those seeking a comfortable African travel experience.

detailed itinerary

DAY 1 Join Victoria Falls

Arriving in Victoria Falls, transfer to the group hotel before time to relax or explore the surrounding area. Set on the banks of the Zambezi River, Victoria Falls is one of Africa's most spectacular natural landmarks and among the world's largest waterfalls. The afternoon and evening are free to browse local markets or join optional activities including scenic flights and sunset cruises.

DAYS 2-3 Chobe River Safari & Game Viewing

Crossing into Botswana, the journey continues to accommodation positioned on the banks of the Chobe River. Chobe National Park is renowned for its exceptional wildlife viewing, large elephant populations and abundant birdlife across riverine floodplains and woodland environments. During the stay, enjoy a morning 4WD game drive and a sunset game viewing cruise along the Chobe River while searching for elephant, hippo, antelope and birdlife throughout the park.

DAY 4 Arrive at the Okavango Delta (320km / 199mi, 5hrs)

Travelling through Chobe National Park, the route enters Namibia before continuing into Botswana towards the Okavango Delta. Floodplains, reed-lined waterways

and wetland ecosystems dominate the landscapes surrounding this remarkable wilderness region. The Okavango Delta is one of Africa's most important wildlife habitats and the world's largest inland delta system.

DAY 5 Mokoro Excursions in the Okavango Delta

Travel 30 minutes by boat into the Okavango Delta for mokoro and boat excursions through the back channels of the Nxamasire area. Reed-lined waterways, seasonal floodplains and smaller islands create one of Africa's most remarkable wetland wilderness environments. Subject to water levels, guided nature walks are also undertaken on smaller islands while exploring the delta region and its birdlife habitats.

DAY 6 Journey Along the Okavango River (430km / 267mi, 6hrs)

Leaving the Okavango Delta behind, the journey crosses back into Namibia through the Caprivi Strip. Riverine forests, lush vegetation and broad waterways contrast sharply with the surrounding dry landscapes of northern Namibia. Overnight accommodation overlooks the Okavango River towards Angola.

DAY 7 Etosha National Park Game Drive

Continuing west, the journey reaches Etosha National Park for an afternoon 4WD game drive. Waterholes and open plains attract wildlife including elephant, lion, zebra, giraffe, springbok and antelope throughout the reserve. Etosha is one of Africa's most significant wildlife sanctuaries and among Namibia's premier safari destinations.

DAY 8 Explore the Salt Pans & Wildlife of Etosha National Park (150km / 93mi)

Wildlife viewing continues across the eastern sector of Etosha National Park after breakfast. Travelling via Etosha Pan, the route searches for species including cheetah, leopard, kudu, zebra and springbok across vast open landscapes and salt pan environments. The journey exits the park during the afternoon towards the lodge.

DAY 9 Travel Through the Landscapes of Damaraland

Travelling south-west through Damaraland, the route passes rugged mountain ranges, open plains, dry riverbeds and dramatic granite formations. One of Namibia's

trip grading Adventure touring

Although there is no commitment to extended walking on this journey we nonetheless want to keep the 'accent on the active'. We therefore advise that any physical training you complete before undertaking the trip will be to good effect. Although our day walks are optional there is no shortage of advantages of packing as much into your time in Southern Africa as possible. Whether this includes climbing the sand dunes in Namibia or taking part in the adventure activities at Victoria Falls, the fitter you are the more this will enhance your experience.

DAYS 10-11 Swakopmund, Walvis Bay & Atlantic Coast

Driving south through the rugged landscapes of Damaraland, the journey reaches Namibia's Atlantic coastline at Swakopmund. Positioned between the Namib Desert and the Atlantic Ocean, Swakopmund is known for its German colonial architecture, seaside promenades and relaxed coastal atmosphere. The afternoon and following day are free to explore the town or join optional excursions including dolphin cruises, Sandwich Harbour tours and other adventure activities available throughout the region.

DAYS 12-13 Sossusvlei Dunes, Deadvlei & Sesriem Canyon

Travelling south through ever-changing desert scenery, the route reaches accommodation positioned on the edge of the Namib Desert. Towering dunes, rugged mountains and vast open plains dominate this remote landscape. The following morning includes an early departure into the dune belt to witness the changing colours of some of the world's highest sand dunes before a walk to Sossusvlei and Deadvlei. Later in the day, explore Sesriem Canyon, a narrow natural canyon carved deep into the desert landscape.

DAY 14 Fish River Canyon & Southern Namibia

Continuing south through remote desert landscapes, the journey reaches one of Namibia's most spectacular natural landmarks. Late afternoon is spent visiting Fish River Canyon, regarded as one of the largest canyons in the world and an awe-inspiring feature of southern Namibia's arid wilderness region.

Accommodation: Canyon Village or similar

DAYS 15-16 Kalahari & Kgalagadi Wildlife Safaris

Crossing into South Africa, the journey enters the vast landscapes of the Kalahari and Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park. Red dunes, dry riverbeds and sparse vegetation create ideal conditions for viewing predators and desert-adapted wildlife across one of Africa's largest conservation regions. Morning and afternoon game drives search for species including antelope, birdlife and the famous black-maned Kalahari lion throughout this remote wilderness environment.

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adventure travel

By its very nature adventure travel involves an element of the unexpected. In remote and developing countries do not expect standards you are used to at home. Remote areas are sometimes unpredictable and itineraries may be altered. DAY 17 Discover Auwabies Falls & the Orange River

Travelling south through oasis landscapes and wine-growing regions, the route reaches Auwabies Falls National Park. The mighty Orange River plunges 56m into the gorge below at a site known locally as Aukoerebis, meaning 'place of great noise'. The afternoon is spent exploring the many viewpoints overlooking the falls and surrounding rocky landscapes.

Accommodation: Auwabies Falls Lodge or similar

DAY 18 Journey Through Namaqualand

The journey continues south through the rugged landscapes of Namaqualand towards the Van Rhyns Pass region. Semi-desert terrain, mountain backdrops and seasonal wildflowers characterise this remote part of South Africa. Between August and October, the region is transformed by colourful spring flower displays across the arid landscape.

Accommodation: Highlanders Guesthouse or similar

DAY 19 Travel to Cape Town (approx 425 kms/7 hrs drive)

Travelling via the spectacular Van Rhyns Pass, the journey arrives in Cape Town beneath the towering backdrop of Table Mountain. Set between dramatic coastlines and rugged mountains, Cape Town is one of South Africa's most scenic and culturally vibrant cities. The afternoon and evening are free to explore the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront or relax at the accommodation.

DAY 20 Cape Peninsula & Table Mountain

Departing the hotel after breakfast, a full day peninsula tour travels via Hout Bay and Chapman's Peak along the Atlantic coastline towards Cape Point within Table Mountain National Park. Returning along the Indian Ocean coastline, the day also includes a cable car ascent of Table Mountain, one of the New 7 Natural Wonders of the World, weather permitting. The evening is free to enjoy Cape Town's waterfront atmosphere and restaurants.

DAY 21 Tour Concludes in Cape Town

Your African Wildlife Explorer journey concludes in Cape Town beneath the iconic backdrop of Table Mountain. Breakfast is followed by a transfer to Cape Town Airport for onward travel arrangements.

country information

Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe is in south-central Africa, between the Limpopo and the mighty Zambezi Rivers (home of the famous Victoria Falls). It is a landlocked country that boasts varied landscapes; from granite hills, green and fertile plains, high moorlands and craggy, forest-topped mountains to rolling savannah.

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Botswana

Botswana in the centre of Southern Africa, is almost 582,000 sq. kms in area and is largely arid and semi arid, plains, pans and deserts. The Okavango Delta, is a rich and diverse habitat where the Okavango River drains into the sands of the Kalahari Desert. Formerly known as Bechuanaland, the former British protectorate gained independence in 1966. Shortly after independence, the discovery of 3 of the worlds richest diamond deposits helped in economic development of this stable and democratic African nation. Botswana is considered an African success story, with strong democratic institutions, little corruption, freedom of speech and sustained economic growth. With a population of more than 1.5 million, including many different tribal groups, the majority of people are Tswana, while other groups include the Herero, Mbukushu, Yei, San, Kalanga and Kgalagadi.

Namibia

On the South West Africa Coast, sandwiched between the Kalahari Desert and the wild South Atlantic, Namibia has deserts, and dunes as well as coasts and canyons. Formerly a colony of Germany an later a colony of South Africa, the now independent Namibia is rich in natural resources and enjoys modern infrastructure and diverse traditional cultures

South Africa

South Africa is a huge and diverse nation covering the entire Southern Tip of the African continent. The Rainbow Nation is home to an incredible diversity of peoples who are working on forging a new future a decade after the fall of the Apartheid regime. The land is as diverse as the people, from the postcard perfection of Cape Town and the Table Mountain to the rugged splendour of the Orange River and the teeming metropolis of Johannesburg.

climate

Southern Africa experiences a generally dry climate. In and around Johannesburg - There is a summer rainy season from November to March. The dry season from April to October includes the winter, when rain is rare and the nights can be very cold. Days are usually clear, warm and sunny and nights can get frosty in June and July. In and around Cape Town, the rain falls through winter (April to October) with a dry, warm summer (November to March).

a typical day

This trip involves some long driving days which will require early starts. Roads can be dusty and bumpy however we travel in custom built expedition vehicles which make our journeys as comfortable as possible.

dietary requirements

Provided we are advised in advance of your departure we are able to cater for vegetarian diets and can assist with medically recommended diets (allergies and intolerances). Please ensure you discuss your requirements with us well in advance (at least 1 month prior to your trip) to determine whether we can cater to such dietary requirements on your chosen adventure. Please note that options are likely to be limited in very remote locations or alternatives may be more expensive or unavailable. There may be times when those with special requirements may need to provide their own food. We are unable to guarantee a peanut-free or allergen-free trip, and therefore, we strongly encourage that travellers with life-threatening or severe allergies take all necessary medical precautions to prepare for the possibility of exposure. Passengers must travel with all necessary medications for food allergies and be capable of self-administering these medications.

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accommodation on the trip



All accommodation for this tour is in 3 to 4 star comfortable safari lodges and permanent tented camps full of character, based on twin share rooms with private ensuite facilities.

Note that a single supplement is compulsory for this trip if you are travelling alone. If you prefer to share, please advise us at time of booking and we will try to match you with another person of the same gender and also willing to share. This is rarely possible but if a match does happen we will be able to refund the single supplement approx 4 weeks prior to departure.

what you carry

In your daypack you will need to carry extra warm clothing (it can be very cold on early morning activities), a rainjacket, water bottle, camera gear, valuables and personal items such as sunscreen, lip balm etc.

equipment required

Specialist gear required include walking boots or shoes and a day pack (a comprehensive gear list is provided in the pre-departure information provided on booking).

non exclusive trips

Please note that this trip is not exclusive to World Expeditions clients and is operated by our partners in Southern Africa. Your participation and involvement is an integral part of an enjoyable and successful journey. Groups are pleasantly informal and are aimed at healthy, active participants looking for an adventurous holiday. You will be joining a group with a mix of participants from different countries and other group participants therefore may not speak English. The groups travel in custom built safari vehicles.

wildlife

The wilderness areas of Africa are populated by large numbers of wild and potentially dangerous animals. The trip aims to view these animals in their natural habitat, uncontrolled by fences. Your experienced guides will make every effort to ensure the safety of the group at all times. Please be aware that all safari travel, including vehicle safaris in the proximity of wild animals is never entirely without risk. By travelling into wild areas in search of wild animals, all participants accept that they are choosing an adventure that includes an element of risk and this is an inherent aspect of the enjoyment of this style of travel.

chobe national park

Chobe National Park, in Botswana's northwest, was the country's first official national park. Its original inhabitants were the San bushmen, a nomadic people who moved constantly in search of food. Original San paintings can still be found inside rocky hills of the park. The park is best known for its number of Kalahari elephants, over 50,000, which is Africa's largest concentration. Lion, hyena, antelope, wildebeest, warthog, hippopotamus and zebras are also commonly visible. The area's bird life is also prolific with more than 450 species recorded in the park.

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okavango delta

The Okavango Delta is the world's largest inland Delta. Today, the Okavango River has no outlet to the sea but instead empties onto the sands of the Kalahari Desert. The Okavango is home to an abundance of wildlife and attracts thousands of visitors each year. Elephants, buffalo, hippopotamus, wildebeest, giraffe, lion, cheetah, and leopard can all be found here. The park is also home to hyena, kudu, antelope, and both black and white rhinoceros. The delta also includes over 400 species of birds, including the African Fish Eagle, the Crested Crane, the Lilac-breasted Roller, and the Sacred Ibis.

vehicles & safety

During the course of your trip, we will use a variety of vehicles, all of which are fit for purpose and the conditions encountered. It should be noted that laws governing transportation safety may differ from those in your home country and whilst wherever possible, vehicles with seatbelts are provided, on occasion some vehicles may not have seat belts fitted.

visas

Zimbabwe

You will need to complete an Online Declaration before arrival into Zimbabwe: <https://evisa.gov.zw/app/index.html#/home>

Visas are required for Zimbabwe for all the following nationalities and can be obtained at the border/ on arrival. These visa fees are payable (in cash only) on arrival at port of entry and are subject to change without notice:

United States of America US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

United Kingdom US\$ 55 single entry; US\$ 70 double entry

Canada US\$ 75 single entry only; double entry not available

Australia US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

New Zealand US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

A common tourist visa was recently introduced for Zambia and Zimbabwe known as the (KAZA) UNIVISA. The US\$50 Univisa (recommend to pay in cash) is valid for 30 days and allows the bearer to enter both Zambia and Zimbabwe. So if you think you will cross into Zambia even for a short period from Zimbabwe (eg. to look at Victoria Falls from that side), then it is better to purchase the Univisa. Full details including ports of entry issuing the Univisa, the eligible countries and more are available here: <https://www.zambiaimmigration.gov.zm/kaza-univisa/>

Keep in mind that if you are visiting Botswana for longer than a day trip, you will need to get a single entry visa (for Zambia or Zimbabwe depending on where you land) or a Univisa (if you plan to visit both Zambia and Zimbabwe), then visit Botswana and on return, will need to purchase another single entry visa or Univisa. In other words – if you have a Univisa but leave the joint Zambia/Zimbabwe area, you will have to buy a new visa on re-arrival.

All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

Visa requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or reservations consultant.

All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

Regulations have been implemented for people travelling with children to/from Botswana. Anyone who is a minor (less than 18 years) must produce an original birth certificate in addition to a valid passport. If the child is not travelling with both parents named on their birth certificate a statutory declaration or affidavit made by the parent/s who are not accompanying the child, declaring that they give consent for the accompanying adult/s to travel with the child. This should be done and signed before a Justice of Peace. If the new requirements are not met, then boarding can be denied by any airline flying to/from Botswana, or travellers may be turned back at the border. If this applies to you, please make enquiries with your respective Botswana consulate/mission to confirm, as the conditions frequently change. We can assist with contact details of the relevant authorities if required.

Namibia

A visa is now required for most nationalities. Please ensure you get this beforehand as it is not possible to get at most border posts. You will need to apply for a Visa On Arrival (VOA) Online Application - NOT a Holiday visa. This automatically gives you a multiple entry visa, and valid for 90 days from the date of issue. Fees apply. Below is the link for the online VOA applications: <https://eservices.mhaiss.gov.na/visaonarrival>

The VOA Online Application must be completed electronically before arrival into Namibia. The visa costs NAD 1,600 (approximately USD90) for citizens from non-African countries (fees are subject to an annual review).

To apply for the visa you will require the below documentation:

For Visa on Arrival (VOA) Online applications: A valid passport with 6 months validity and 3 blank pages. Accurately completed Online Visa Application Form. Approved and printed E-visa Permit.

Travellers arriving in Namibia with Visa on Arrival online approval must ensure that they are prepared to present CONFIRMATION of any visa requirements as per online application completed, upon entry if requested by Immigration.

Regulations are in place for people travelling with children to/from Namibia. Anyone who is a minor (less than 18 years) must produce a certified copy of their unabridged (original) birth certificate in addition to a valid passport.

If the child is not travelling with both parents named on their birth certificate a statutory declaration or affidavit must be given by the parent/s or legal guardian/s who are not accompanying the child, declaring that they give consent for the accompanying adult/s or legal guardian/s to travel with the child. This should be done and signed before a Justice of Peace. Other additional documents may also be required; for example – death certificate (if one parent is deceased); copies of their parents'/legal guardians' passports or identity documents; contact details of the minor's parents/legal guardians. If the new requirements are not met, then boarding can be denied by any airline flying to/from Namibia, or travellers may be turned back at the border. If this applies to you, please make enquiries with your respective Namibia consulate/mission to confirm, as the conditions frequently change. We can assist with contact details of the relevant authorities if required.

In-person Visa on Arrival applications require: A valid passport with 6 months validity and 3 blank pages. Completed Visa on Arrival Application Form. Invitation letter (if required, note not needed for tourism purposes). Confirmation of accommodation and travel bookings/plans. Confirmation of Medical/Travel Insurance. Full birth certificate and parental consent letter if travelling with children.

Follow these steps to apply online for your visa:

- 1: Open the MHAISS website: <https://eservices.mhaiss.gov.na>
- 2: Choose Visa on Arrival, register and select country of origin
- 3: Complete ALL the required details

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4: If accepted proceed and Submit Payment

5: Print your E-Visa Permit for presentation in Namibia

6: Complete the New Namibia Arrival Form (to be signed at the Immigration counter in presence of official).

South Africa

Visas for South Africa are exempt for a stay of less than 90 days for passport holders from the following countries:-

Australia, Canada, United States, United Kingdom, New Zealand

*All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

New Requirement SARS Online Traveller Declaration: The South African Revenue Service (SARS) has introduced a mandatory Online Traveller Declaration for international travellers entering and leaving South Africa. Travellers must complete the online declaration within 24 hours before departure to South Africa. For those travelling on connecting flights, the declaration should be completed within 24 hours before the final flight to South Africa.

After submission: Travellers will receive an electronic confirmation by email, which should be kept on their mobile device or printed and available on arrival if requested by Customs officials.

Please bear in mind that visas may be required for countries you are visiting en route or transiting through on the way to your destination. It is important that you check the requirements of all countries you will visit. Visa costs and requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or World Expeditions reservations consultant. It is your responsibility to obtain all necessary visas.
