the trip

This is a trip for active travellers seeking rare wildlife encounters. Track chimpanzees and more than a dozen other primates in Kibale Forest with the help of expert trackers. Walk alongside reintroduced white rhinos on foot in Ziwa Sanctuary, and explore the varied ecosystems of Queen Elizabeth National Park, from crater lakes to savannah and wetlands teeming with birdlife. Cruise to the base of Murchison Falls as the Nile crashes through a narrow gorge, then venture deep into Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, home to half the world's remaining mountain gorillas. Trek steep, misty jungle to stand quietly within metres of a gorilla family - a moment few travellers ever forget. With insightful local guides and a rewarding mix of walking, safari, and relaxed lodge comfort, this journey reveals the full spectrum of Uganda's natural beauty.

additional deposits required

In addition to the World Expeditions deposit, you will be required to pay a deposit of USD\$1420 (paid in your local currency at the current rate of exchange) to pay for the Gorilla and Chimp permits and accommodation deposit. This deposit is non-refundable and we recommend you take out travel insurance at the time of booking.

*Please note that Gorilla permits often sell out 4-6 months in advance so the earlier you book the greater chance you will be able to travel on your chosen day. Passport details are required to obtain permits so will be required at the time of booking.

detailed itinerary

DAY 1 Join Entebbe

On arrival at Entebbe International Airport in Uganda, you shall be welcomed by your guide and transferred to the group hotel for overnight.

Accommodation: Boma Guest House or similar

meals: NIL

DAY 2 Drive to Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary and Murchison Falls National Park

After breakfast, you will drive to Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary where you will undertake a walking safari to view the Southern White Rhinos that have been re-introduced in Uganda. In the afternoon you will drive to the legendary Murchison Falls National Park - Uganda's largest national park.

Accommodation: Murchison River Lodge or similar

Drive: 364 km/6 hours

DAY 3 Morning game drive, afternoon River Nile boat cruise to Murchison Falls

After an early breakfast, we will undertake a morning game drive. This is a beautiful drive across savannah, Borassus Palm Forest and grassland down to Lake Albert where the Albert Nile River heads north. We drive in the open African savannah in search of Lions, Leopard, Hyena, Buffalo, Elephant, Jackson Hartebeest, Oribi, Waterbucks, Uganda Kobs, in addition to spotting various bird species such as the Secretary Bird, Black Chested Snake Eagle, Tawny and Marshal Eagles, Carmine and Swallow Tailed Bee-Eaters, and many more.

In the afternoon, we enjoy a boat ride up the Nile River to the spectacular Murchison Falls. We hike to the top of the falls and marvel as the Nile squeezes through a 7 metre gap, with enormous Nile Crocodiles basking at the bottom.

DAY 4 Drive to Kibale National Park

This morning you will drive to Kibale National Park. Along the way you will pass many tea plantations and have an opportunity to visit a tea plantation. We will also stop in Fort Portal and visit the Toro Palace. In the afternoon you will arrive at your accommodation.

Accommodation: Kibale Forest Camp or Isunga Lodge or similar

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thoughtful travel

The natural environments that you'll travel through are fragile; the cultures and traditions precious and often the communities we pass through are reliant on tourism. It is our responsibility as visitors to minimise the impact of our presence, protect what is precious and where we can leave a positive impact. trip grading Adventure touring

These adventure tours visit remote areas of the world where facilities are often basic.

These adventure tours will often involve long journeys and rough roads. Sightseeing and optional day walks are often included and these days may involve up to 5 hours of physical activity. To enjoy these adventures we suggest you are reasonably fit, healthy, have a moderately active lifestyle and have a positive attitude. The fitter you are for your trip, the more of a holiday it will be. The gorilla tracking will sometimes be quite strenuous and will involve following trails beaten through the forests. These trails are often wet, steep and slippery.

* Suggested preparation: Two or three times a week, we recommend you walk on undulating terrain for an hour or more, for at least 3 months prior to departure.

adventure travel

By its very nature adventure travel involves an element of the unexpected. In remote and developing countries do not expect standards you are used to at home. Remote areas are sometimes unpredictable and itineraries may be altered. To get the most out of your adventure it is important that you are flexible, positive and eager to take on all the challenges that arise. If you are uncertain about your suitability for this trip we recommend that you speak with your consultant or travel agent.

DAY 5 Morning chimp trek, drive to Queen Elizabeth National Park

After an early morning breakfast, you will undertake a chimp trek. Note: the chimp permits are subject to availability - there are two slots in either the early morning (when they are often up in the trees feeding and more active) or at mid morning (when they often come down to take a nap as it is cooler on the forest floor and therefore closer and more relaxed). Both of these viewing slots are rewarding and interesting.

Kibale's 795 sq km National Park contains one of the most beautiful and varying tracts of tropical forest in the whole of Uganda. This is home to 13 species of primate including chimpanzees. The park's highest point is at 1590m above sea level. After lunch we will proceed to Queen Elizabeth National Park, and enjoy a game drive on the way to our lodge. Named after Her Majesty's Queen Elizabeth of England, it is Uganda's most popular and scenic game reserve. It stretches from the crater-dotted foothills of the Rwenzori range in the north, along the shores of Lake Edward to the remote Ishasha River in the south, incorporating a wide variety of habitats that range from open savannah, wetlands, crater lakes and rainforest.

Drive: 4-5 hour game drive

DAY 6 Morning game drive, afternoon Kazinga Channel boat cruise

This morning we will have an early morning game drive. Queen Elizabeth National Park includes parts of Lakes Edward and George which are linked by the Kazinga channel. The park boasts the world's highest bio-diversity rating with over 600 bird and 100 mammal species including lions, hippos, buffaloes, leopard, Spotted Hyena, elephants and the elusive Giant Forest Hog. The primates include Chimps, Black and White Colobus Monkeys, Blue, Black faced Red Colobus, and Red tailed monkeys and Olive Baboons. Lunch at the lodge will be followed by an afternoon Kazinga Channel boat cruise.

Accommodation: Marafiki Safari Lodge or similar

Drive 3 hour game drive

DAY 7 Drive to Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, game drive in Ishasha enroute

After breakfast, you will be driven to Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park, passing through the Ishasha Sector of Queen Elizabeth National Park, famous for its tree climbing lions. Bwindi National Park is the habitat of half of the world's Mountain Gorilla population and also home to chimpanzee, monkeys, elephants, small antelope and birdlife. Your accommodation tonight is located near Bwindi National Park.

Accommodation: Engagi Lodge or similar

Drive 150km/5 hours (including game drive)

DAY 8 Gorilla trek in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, drive to Lake Bunyonyi

A very early start for the short drive to Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park for your Gorilla trek. You will be taken to the Park Headquarters for a short briefing after which you will enter the forest and start your Gorilla trek (please note that a drive may be required to your trekking starting point). The trek can be anything from 2 hours to 6 hours or longer depending on the location of the Gorillas on the day. The terrain is rough, often over steep slopes covered with matted vegetation.

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important note

These trip notes represent the most current information for this itinerary, and may supersede any information on our website, including but not limited to the itinerary and price. The itinerary should be seen as a guide only. This itinerary may change at any time due to inclement weather, forces of nature and other circumstances beyond our control.

You will be led by an experienced ranger who will tell you interesting facts about the flora and fauna and the lifestyle of the Gorillas. Be prepared for rain, mud and giant stinging nettles – long trousers, gloves and a waterproof jacket will help. The mountain gorillas have inspired travellers from all over the world to experience one of nature's greatest interactions. Anyone who has witnessed the Mountain Gorillas of East Africa will strongly agree that it is a once in a lifetime experience that will never be forgotten. Afterwards we will drive to Lake Bunyonyi for overnight.

Accommodation: Birds Nest Resort or similar

Drive: 60 km/1.5 hours

DAY 9 Drive to Lake Mburo National Park

This morning after breakfast we will depart Bwindi and drive to Lake Mburo National Park, the only park in Uganda with an entire lake. Here we enjoy a brief game drive along the way to your accommodation. Lake Mburo National Park forms a mosaic-like habitat with rocks, dry slopes, open and wooded savannahs, forests and swamps. These diverse habitats are home to 313 recorded bird species including Flame Head Barbet, Long-tailed Zitting Cisticola (Tabora), African Bins Rail, Collared Barbet and Binding Bush Singer.

Accommodation: Rwakobo Rock or similar

Drive: 180 km/ 4-5 hours (including game drive)

meals: B,L,D

DAY 10 Nature walk, drive to Entebbe, trip concludes

You will get up early morning for a guided nature walk before returning to the lodge for a hearty breakfast. Then you will drive to Entebbe. Time permitting you can stop for a photo opportunity at the Equator. Transfer to Entebbe Airport, where trip concludes. (Please note: earliest departure time is 18:00hrs).

country information

Uganda was once described by Winston Churchill as the "Pearl of Africa" and for good reason. Despite a history of tragedies following the destructive actions of Idi Amin in the 1970's, the country is captivating. With the best of everything Africa can offer condensed into one country, wonderfully friendly people and relatively few tourists, Uganda is becoming increasingly more stable and a safe place to visit. The tallest mountain range in Africa (the Rwenzoris), the Nile River - one of the longest in the world - and one of the highest concentrations of primates around the globe are all found here. A huge diversity of birdlife is also supported as a result of merging habitats from northern, eastern and western Africa. Agriculture is the most important

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component of the economy with exports including coffee, sugar, cotton, tea and fish. Despite their horrific history, Ugandan people are very polite and friendly. Free primary school education for all has been a priority in recent years although the country's rapidly growing population has put pressure on resources to carry out this ideal. A diverse range of tribes make up this population, with about 85% being Christian, 12% Muslim and the small remainder practising Judaism.

climate

Although close to the equator, Uganda's mostly tropical climate is not uniform across the country due to its varying topography. Southern Uganda is wettest with the Rwenzori Mountains (in the south west) receiving heavy rainfall all year. Entebbe and Kampala have a wet season from March to June and again in November/December.

Kampala and Entebbe tend to be quite humid, being situated on the shore of Lake Victoria. Temperatures range from about 25-30°C during the day to 14-16°C at night but can feel quite a bit warmer due to the humidity. In the mountains, you can expect much cooler temperatures.

PLEASE NOTE: we suggest you pack a waterproof jacket with a hood for all departures.

a typical day

Depending on the itinerary for the day, we will either be travelling, sightseeing or game viewing. We will generally have an early breakfast to ensure we maximise our touring time. When staying inside the National Parks, we will generally wake with a hot drink and commence our game drives with a packed breakfast. This allows us to maximise our time to see the animals when they are most active. Patience and persistence is required when searching for wildlife but the thrill of spontaneous encounters is unbeatable. We may return to our accommodation mid-morning or stay out all day with a picnic lunch. After lunch, further game driving or sightseeing will take place or there will be leisure time for you to read and relax.

dietary requirements

Provided we are advised in advance of your departure we are able to cater for vegetarian diets and can assist with medically recommended diets (allergies and intolerances). Please ensure you discuss your requirements with us well in advance (at least 1 month prior to your trip) to determine whether we can cater to such dietary requirements on your chosen adventure. Please note that options are likely to be limited in very remote locations or alternatives may be more expensive or unavailable. There may be times when those with special requirements may need to provide their own food. We are unable to guarantee a peanut-free or allergen-free trip, and therefore, we strongly encourage that travellers with life-threatening or severe allergies take all necessary medical precautions to prepare for the possibility of exposure. Passengers must travel with all necessary medications for food allergies and be capable of self-administering these medications.

accommodation on the trip



For this accommodated safari, we make use of mid-range lodge accommodation. Your accommodation is situated either in National Parks, on the banks of a river, or in other places of interest. The accommodation will be a mix of safari lodges and permanent safari camp on a twinshare basis with en-suite facilities. Some properties are equipped with swimming pools and/or bar areas.

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what you carry

In your daypack you will need to carry extra warm clothing, a rainjacket, water bottle, camera gear, valuables and personal items such as sunscreen, lip balm, etc.

equipment required

Specialist gear required include walking boots and day pack (a comprehensive gear list is provided in the pre-departure information provided on booking).

non exclusive trips

Please note that this trip is not exclusive to World Expeditions clients and is operated by our partners in Uganda. Your participation and involvement is an integral part of an enjoyable and successful journey. Groups are pleasantly informal, usually comprising a wide range of nationalities and are aimed at healthy, active participants looking for an adventurous holiday.

wildlife

The wilderness areas of Africa are populated by large numbers of wild and potentially dangerous animals. The trip aims to view these animals in their natural habitat, uncontrolled by fences. Your experienced guides will make every effort to ensure the safety of the group at all times. Please be aware that all safari travel, including vehicle safaris in the proximity of wild animals is never entirely without risk. By travelling into wild areas in search of wild animals, all participants accept that they are choosing an adventure that includes an element of risk and this is an inherent aspect of the enjoyment of this style of travel.

gorilla tracking

Mountain gorillas are gentle giants - almost entirely vegetarian, they eat over a hundred different plant species and some insects. They live in stable groups, which vary in size between two and thirty individuals and inhabit forests at elevations between 2800m and 3400m. The steeply forested landscape is incredibly dense and criss-crossed by numerous animal trails – our guides will have to hack a path through thick damp undergrowth. Authorities enforce strict guidelines about how visitors may behave near the gorillas and your guide will brief you on this. Each gorilla group is visited only once a day to keep human influences and contact to a minimum. The maximum size of groups visiting the gorillas is eight people. Gorilla groups are dominated by a senior male, normally more than fifteen years old (ages of up to thirty-five have been recorded in captivity, but many people believe that gorillas may live longer). Such males stand about 1.75m tall and weigh around 180kg – they are the undisputed leaders of their groups. The dominant male is called the 'silverback', and he is the breeding male. Females begin to breed at about eight years of age and will produce offspring roughly every four years. Unfortunately, infant mortality is as high as 30%. Strictly diurnal, the gorilla spends the day feeding and resting. Because of their size and bulk they move and climb slowly – it is most rare to see an adult gorilla in a tree, other than on lower sloping trunks. Each night they build a nest in which to sleep. They communicate with a variety of grunts, screams and roars.

The biggest killer for specifically gorillas is normal colds / coughs / pneumonia and the like, and if a client is visibly sick, coughing etc. on the morning of the trek they will not be allowed to proceed on a trek, this is at the discretion of the National Parks staff to decide and is done 100% to protect the wellbeing and health of the gorillas and other primates that clients will be trekking to. Costs for treks will not be refunded by the National Parks authority or our local partner or World Expeditions, but will be a matter of an insurance claim.

The age limit for all treks to all primates (including to the gorillas) is 15 years. Guests/trekkers have to turn 15 latest the day of the trek, and this rule is unfortunately "written in rock"! This is because children have 'stronger' germs, even if they are not feeling sick themselves; potentially lethal to Gorillas who don't have any resistance to such germs.

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vehicles & safety

During the course of your trip, we will use a variety of vehicles, all of which are fit for purpose and the conditions encountered. It should be noted that laws governing transportation safety may differ from those in your home country and whilst wherever possible, vehicles with seatbelts are provided, on occasion some vehicles may not have seat belts fitted.

visas

Visas for Uganda are required for passport holders from the following countries:-

New Zealand

Canada

United Kingdom

United States

Uganda Immigration have implemented the use of Electronic Visas.

All visitors who require an entry visa and do not yet have one, must apply through the online application system prior to arrival.

Online applications must be made through the visa immigration website on <https://visas.immigration.go.ug>

You are required to upload clear copies of current passport page, Yellow fever certificate and Passport photo.

If the application has the online payment as mandatory, this means that the online application will not be submitted for processing until your credit card payment is received.

The approval letter sent by email or downloaded through the Uganda electronic Visa/Permit web site establishes that you are eligible for the approved visa or permit, but does not establish that you are definitely approved.

It is recommended that you bring a printout of your visa approval letter to Uganda. The barcode present in the approval letter will be used for accessing your application at the point of entry so bringing it printed will speed up the final approval process done. This final approval will be done at the selected point of entry (in the case of a visa) or at the Immigration Office Headquarters where the visa or permit sticker will be printed and placed in your passport.

It is possible to apply for an East Africa Tourist Visa (EATV) which allows applicants wishing to travel to the East African Community (EAC) countries of Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda to obtain one visa to cover all three countries. The visa allows for multiple entry within the EAC region within the validity period of 90 days. Once a traveller goes out of the three countries and comes back to either Kenya/Rwanda/Uganda, it will be considered as a new journey and not a continuation, hence the EATV visa is deemed expired and you would then have to apply for a single entry permit to re-enter either Kenya/Rwanda/Uganda. Applicants must apply for the visa through the Embassy of the country they will be entering first and will be obliged to enter only through that country. If entering first via Kenya, the East Africa Tourist Visa (which covers Kenya, Rwanda & Uganda) is available on application at the Kenya High Commission and costs USD\$100/AUD\$140. Note that this multiple country visa arrangement does NOT include Tanzania.

Please bear in mind that visas may be required for countries you are visiting en route or transiting through on the way to your destination. It is important that you check the requirements of all countries you will visit. Visa costs and requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or World Expeditions reservations consultant. It is your responsibility to obtain all necessary visas.
