the trip

On this superb hiking adventure we bring to life western USA's most famous parks, home to some of the most dramatic wind and water sculptured landscapes in the world. During a series of selected hikes, we absorb the geysers, giant waterfalls, prolific wildlife and valleys full of boiling mud pots in Yellowstone, trek in the Grand Canyon, visit Horseshoe Bend and Antelope Canyon and hike in the dramatic Rocky Mountains. From Aspen and Glenwood Springs we undertake some world class day hikes in the Rockies and enjoy picture postcard vistas, such as Maroon Bells. Linking the parks and hikes are stunning drives such as the 'Million Dollar Highway', considered to be the most scenic in North America. A visit to Monument Valley and our final night in Las Vegas rounds off this exhilarating adventure.

detailed itinerary

DAY 1 Arrive in Bozeman

Welcome to Bozeman! Arrive at your hotel via airport shuttle or local taxi and settle in after your long journey. Take time to relax this evening in preparation for the great adventures ahead.

- Overnight: Days Inn - Bozeman

DAY 2 Yellowstone National Park

Today, we head into the world's first national park, Yellowstone. The park is home to the most impressive geothermal areas on Earth and one of the densest concentrations of megafauna outside Africa, including bison, wolves, elk, moose, and of course bears. Our first stop on the adventure is Mammoth Hot Springs, where we visit the visitor center, watch for the resident elk herd, and get an initial glimpse of some of the park's fascinating thermal features. From there, we enjoy a warm-up hike directly from the visitor center before transferring to Gardiner to settle in for the evening.

- Overnight: Yellowstone Big Rock Inn or similar
- Drive time: ~100 mi / 160 km, or 2.5 hrs
- Hiking: 5.5 mi / 8.9 km, 3-4 hrs, +/-220 m
- meals: B,L

DAY 3 Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone

We spend the day exploring the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, one of the park's most dramatic landscapes. Carved by the Yellowstone River and framed by vividly colored canyon walls, this area offers a powerful introduction to the forces that shaped the park. We hike along the canyon rim, taking in ever-changing views of the river far below, then visit one of Yellowstone's marquee overlooks, Artist Point, to admire the thundering falls from several sublime vantage points. A quintessential day in Yellowstone.

- Overnight: Kelly Inn or similar, West Yellowstone • Drive time: ~78 mi / 125 km, or ~3 hrs
- Hiking: 5 mi / 8 km, 3-4 hrs, +/-200 m

DAY 4 Yellowstone's Grand Prismatic and Old Faithful

No visit to Yellowstone would be complete without exploring the park's fantastic geothermal features. Still considered an active volcano, reminders of Yellowstone's

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adventure travel

violent geological past abound. We start today with a visit to the spectacular Grand Prismatic Spring, the largest hot spring in the nation. The spring's brilliant rings of brown, yellow, blue, green and orange are caused by microbes that live at the edges of the mineral-rich water. We continue to Upper Geyser Basin to explore the many additional geysers, hot springs and fumaroles there and our afternoon culminates as we witness the iconic eruption of Old Faithful.

DAY 5 Jenny Lake Ferry, drive to Jackson, Wyoming

Today, we journey into the spectacular landscapes of Grand Teton National Park, where soaring mountain peaks rise dramatically above the crystal waters of Jenny Lake. Enjoy an included scenic ferry ride across the lake before setting out on a self-guided hike along one of the park's most iconic trails. Your Tour Director will meet you at the end of the hike with transportation to continue the day's adventure. Later, enjoy free time to explore the lively cafes, galleries, and western charm of Jackson, Wyoming, before settling in for the evening in this beloved mountain town.

DAY 6 Day in Jackson on Your Own

Today is yours to enjoy independently and at your own pace in the lively mountain town of Jackson, Wyoming. Step out on foot to explore the historic Town Square, browse local boutiques and art galleries, or settle into a café to soak up the relaxed western atmosphere. For time outdoors, walk the scenic Flat Creek Pathway as it meanders through open green space with mountain views. You may also choose to ride the Snow King gondola, enjoy a leisurely lunch, or take an easy stroll through downtown.

For a memorable time on the water, consider booking an optional Snake River scenic float or whitewater trip with Dave Hansen Whitewater, whose downtown office is just a short distance from the hotel.

Please note that today is designed as an independent day, so guide services, transportation, optional activities and excursions are not included in the tour package.

DAY 7 Flaming Gorge Recreation Area

Today we journey through high desert landscapes toward the striking cliffs and turquoise waters of Flaming Gorge. Named for its brilliant red and orange canyon walls, the gorge offers dramatic views as the Green River winds far below. Stretch your legs on a 3-mile hike along scenic trails, where you might spot bighorn sheep,

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eagles, or mule deer amid the rugged canyon terrain. Take in panoramic overlooks that showcase the vibrant contrast between the fiery cliffs and the sparkling reservoir waters, a sight that feels almost otherworldly.

- Overnight: Dinosaur Inn or similar • Drive time: ~287 mi / 462 km, or ~5 hrs total

- Hiking: 3 mi / 4.8km

meals: B,L

DAY 8 Dinosaur National Monument

This morning we explore Dinosaur National Monument, where towering cliffs reveal hundreds of fossilized dinosaur bones embedded in the rock. Wander among the ancient remains and take in the dramatic canyons and river views that have shaped this remarkable landscape for millions of years. After your exploration, we embark on a scenic drive through the high desert and mountain valleys, enjoying the wide-open vistas of northeastern Utah and western Colorado. We'll arrive in Glenwood Springs in the evening, where you can relax and recharge for tomorrow's adventures.

- Overnight: Courtyard Marriott or similar • Drive time: ~172 mi / 277 km, or ~3 hrs total

- Hiking: 4.5 mi / 7.2 km

meals: B,L

DAY 9 Maroon Bells

This morning we head off hiking through dense aspen forests in the Elk Mountains towards the pristine, glacial Maroon Valley. You will enjoy the spectacular twin peaks of Maroon Bells reflecting in the tranquil alpine lakes (due to park regulations this hike is self-guided). This afternoon you are free to explore Aspen. One of the most picturesque towns in the USA, Aspen started as a gold rush town and is now a famous ski and outdoor adventure town. Visit some of the towns renowned boutiques, relax with a coffee, and enjoy the vibrant atmosphere.

- Overnight: Courtyard Marriott or similar • Hiking: 2 mi / 3 km, 2 hrs, +/-50m • Drive time: ~80 mi / 128 km, or 3 hrs

DAY 10 Million Dollar Highway

Today, we travel south through the Rockies along the spectacular Million Dollar Highway, a route famed for its towering cliffs, hairpin turns, and breathtaking vistas. Your guide will stop at scenic pullouts where you can stretch your legs, breathe in the crisp mountain air, and take photos of the rugged San Juan Mountains. Along the way, we pass historic mining towns, rushing rivers, and forests of pine and aspen. Keep an eye out for wildlife such as deer, elk, and soaring hawks. Every turn reveals a new perspective on this dramatic landscape, making the drive a memorable adventure from start to finish.

- Overnight: Holiday Inn Express - Cortez or similar • Drive time: 300 mi / 480 km, or 5.5 hrs

meals: B,L

DAY 11 Monument Valley and Antelope Canyon

We travel through the striking red desert of the Colorado Plateau to the iconic Monument Valley on Navajo Nation lands. Here, we stop and take time to soak in sweeping views of towering sandstone buttes rising from the desert floor. Midday, we continue to Antelope Canyon for a guided tour through its sculpted

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sandstone corridors, where shifting light and flowing rock formations create one of the Southwest's most memorable landscapes. In the afternoon, we make our way to Page along Lake Powell. Stretch your legs at Horseshoe Bend, often referred to as the east rim of the Grand Canyon, where the Colorado River curves dramatically around a sandstone escarpment. As late afternoon light warms the canyon walls, emerald green water contrasts vividly with the surrounding red rock. We settle into our accommodations and look ahead to another day of exploration after a restful evening.

- Overnight: Clarion Inn Page or similar - Lake Powell • Drive time: 250 mi / 400 km, or 4.5 hrs

- Hiking: 1.5 mi / 2.5 km, 1 hr

DAY 12 Grand Canyon

A full day to relax and take in the grandeur of the Grand Canyon. Stretching 277 miles long, up to 18 miles wide, and over a mile deep, the canyon is far too vast to experience all at once, but today's rim walk offers an unforgettable introduction to its scale, color, and ever-changing light.

Start the visit by taking the shuttle to Hermit's Rest, the westernmost point along the South Rim's Hermit Road corridor, then walk back toward Grand Canyon Village along one of the most scenic stretches of the rim. Along the way, the trail reveals sweeping canyon views, dramatic overlooks, layered rock formations, and quiet moments away from the busiest viewpoints. Guests who prefer a shorter walk are welcome to hop on the shuttle earlier along the route, making this a flexible rim experience that can be adjusted for comfort, pace, and energy level. For those searching for a little excitement, helicopter tours, bike rentals and an IMAX theater (to be paid locally, not included in tour package) are available as well.

DAY 13 To Las Vegas

Today will be an early start for those who choose to take an optional helicopter flight. Those who opted out can enjoy a leisurely morning enjoying the park until our late-morning departure. As we head towards our final destination, via the famous Route 66, we'll take time for lunch and few photos stops before reaching Las Vegas. Here we'll check-in to our final hotel of the trip and you have all night to spend exploring the city that never sleeps.

- Overnight: The STRAT Hotel & Casino or similar

- Drive time: 270 mi / 440 km, or 4hrs

DAY 14 Depart from Las Vegas

Our tour comes to an end in the vibrant city of Las Vegas. Wake up refreshed and enjoy a relaxed final morning before departing at your leisure for the airport, home, or wherever your next adventure takes you.

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country information

The Rockies are the high backbone of the lower 48 states, with rows of snow-capped peaks, rugged canyons and wild rivers running over the USA's West. While the Pacific Northwest has active cone shaped volcanoes, the rest of western USA does not. Here we only see the remnants of ancient volcanic activities – in lava flows, hot springs, volcanic fissures and calderas. The area of red rocks in Southwest USA is known as the “Colorado Plateau”, “Canyon Country” or the “Grand Circle”. It is a wonderland of eroded sandstone rock like no where else on earth. The Grand Canyon, specifically, is 277 river miles (446km) long, up to 18 miles (29km) wide, and 1 mile (1.6km) deep. It is an overwhelmingly large area displaying unique combinations of geologic colour and erosional forms.

climate

Be prepared for a wide range of temperatures while on tour. Remember that Western USA experiences a swing in temperatures, depending not only on season and location but also on altitude. This trip will travel through areas of wide differences in climates. Western USA is as far south as southern Europe, experiencing strong sunshine. Make sure you protect yourself against the strong sun. At altitude, and in spring and autumn, morning temperatures are often brisk or cold, warming up fast after the strong sun rises. Therefore we recommend a layering system for clothing, so you can adapt to the temperature changes without problems. As in most deserts, it is the sun that determines the temperatures, making night time temperatures much colder than daytime. Summer (June – early September) temperatures are always hot, but even in Monument Valley or the Grand Canyon, temperatures can be cool at night.

a typical day

As there is one driver-guide, a little group participation is necessary where preparing your daily packed lunch is concerned, and some hikes will be self-guided and/or require the guide to go ahead to collect the vehicle. It is important to understand that you cannot compare the style of trip and number of staff with a trip anywhere in Asia, South America or Africa.

dietary requirements

Provided we are advised in advance of your departure we are able to cater for vegetarian diets and can assist with medically recommended diets (allergies and intolerances). Please ensure you discuss your requirements with us well in advance (at least 1 month prior to your trip) to determine whether we can cater to such dietary requirements on your chosen adventure. Please note that options are likely to be limited in very remote locations or alternatives may be more expensive or unavailable. There may be times when those with special requirements may need to provide their own food. We are unable to guarantee a peanut-free or allergen-free trip, and therefore, we strongly encourage that travellers with life-threatening or severe allergies take all necessary medical precautions to prepare for the possibility of exposure. Passengers must travel with all necessary medications for food allergies and be capable of self-administering these medications.

accommodation on the trip

Accommodation is in twin share. Most nights are spent in comfortable 3 star hotels, and 2 nights are spent in a lodge just 1 mile from the south entrance of Grand Canyon National Park. All have private bathrooms.

what you carry

During all walks you will need a daypack. In your daypack you will need to carry extra warm clothing (depending on the altitude, location and weather), a rainjacket, water bottle, film and camera gear, valuables and personal items such as sunscreen, lip balm etc.

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equipment required

Specialist gear required include walking boots, day pack and a good rainjacket (a comprehensive gear list is provided in the pre-departure information provided on booking).

special visa requirements

Many travellers to the USA (including those from Australia, New Zealand & the UK) must have a pre arranged travel entry authorisation in place. This is obtained electronically for passport holders from countries eligible for the Visa Waiver Program. The authorization must be in place prior to arrival to the USA and can be obtained at the following website <https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov>. Please consult your World Expeditions reservation consultant if you have any questions regarding your eligibility for the Visa Waiver Program. All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

non exclusive trips

This trip is not exclusive to World Expeditions clients. Please note that everyone on this trip is required to sign a release of liability waiver and assumption of risk form supplied by our local operator. It is a prerequisite before you may join the trip. Please note that this is in addition to the World Expeditions standard terms and conditions. If you would like a copy of this form prior to booking, then please let us know.

wildlife

Wildlife depends on habitat. In the mountains of California and the Rockies we find: black bear, elk, herds of mule deer, coyote, and the occasional wolf along with a wide range of rodents (marmots, beaver, etc). There are a lot of birds here, including eagles, hawks, jays and blue birds. In the Rockies you are also likely to see herds of wild bison, brown bear, wolf packs, moose, antelopes, bighorn sheep, mountain goats, porcupines, skunks and fox. The Rockies are a birder's paradise, producing birds such as cranes, singing swans, white pelican, bald eagles and many migratory species.

In the desert, wildlife is more elusive. Due to the heat, it is mostly nocturnal. The most common animals to see while hiking are birds: hawks, eagles, vultures, road runners, jays, blue birds, and the majestic California condor. Ground squirrels and deer are often seen near trails. However, with a little luck we will also see coyotes, ring tail cat, cactus mouse. At times groups see mountain lions, bobcats, or the elusive and endangered big horn sheep.

vehicles & safety

During the course of your trip, we will use a variety of vehicles, all of which are fit for purpose and the conditions encountered. It should be noted that laws governing transportation safety may differ from those in your home country and whilst wherever possible, vehicles with seatbelts are provided, on occasion some vehicles may not have seat belts fitted.

visas

All travellers will require a valid passport to enter the United States and your passport should still be valid for 6 months after you return from your trip. If you are travelling on more than one passport, please use the same passport for the entire trip.

The following information also applies to visitors entering the USA under the Visa Waiver Program (including Australian, New Zealand, and British citizens):

As of April 1, 2016, all travellers must have an e-passport to use the VWP. An e-Passport is an enhanced secure passport with an embedded electronic chip. E-Passports are issued by the proper passport issuing authority and must meet international standards for securing and storing information corresponding to the passport and bearer.

All travellers wishing to enter the US under the VWP will need to hold a passport possessing specified security features. Visa Waiver Program requirements are:

The passport must have a machine-readable zone on the biographic page.

The passport must be an electronic passport with a digital chip containing biometric information about the passport owner.

It is your responsibility to ensure you have the correct passport and that there are sufficient blank pages for any visas required and for entry/departure stamps.

Many travellers to the United States (including Australians, New Zealanders and British) entering the country require a prearranged, approved Electronic System for Travel Authorisation (ESTA). This is obtained electronically for passport holders from countries eligible for the Visa Waiver Program. Travellers must apply at least 72 hours before departure and it can be obtained at the following official website <https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov> for a fee of US\$21 (correct at time of writing, subject to change), payable by credit or debit card. It is very important to make payments through the official website.

Most people who have travelled to Iran, Iraq, Sudan, Cuba or Syria or are dual nationals of these countries, do not qualify for entry under the Visa Waiver Program and existing ESTAs could be revoked. You will instead need to apply for a visa from the nearest US Embassy or Consulate. Certain exemptions apply on a case-by-case basis. Bottom line: If in doubt, please contact the nearest US Embassy or Consulate.

All other passport holders should check with the relevant consul.

Please bear in mind that visas may be required for countries you are visiting en route or transiting through on the way to your destination. It is important that you check the requirements of all countries you will visit. Visa costs and requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or World Expeditions reservations consultant. It is your responsibility to obtain all necessary visas.
