the trip

Travelling in a comfortable, custom-built expedition vehicle and staying in well-appointed accommodation with plenty of local charm, this journey offers an abundance of stunning scenery, unique wildlife and cultural encounters. The vastness of both Namibia and Botswana become apparent with wide open spaces far outnumbering people. A shorter version of our African Wildlife Explorer trip, this overland journey commences from Victoria Falls Zimbabwe. Be enchanted by a Chobe River sunset, and search for wildlife in the contrasting environments of the Okavango Delta and Etosha National Park. Ascend the highest sand dunes in the world at Sossusvlei; and enjoy cosmopolitan Swakopmund with its relaxed cafe culture and wide, tree-lined streets. The trip concludes in Windhoek Namibia.

additional deposits required

detailed itinerary

DAY 1 Join Victoria Falls

On arrival in Victoria Falls, you are transferred to your accommodation and have free time to explore the town. Victoria Falls is one of Africa's most spectacular natural landmarks and forms part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site shared by Zimbabwe and Zambia. The town is known for its local markets, adventure activities and access to the Zambezi River. The afternoon is at leisure before settling into your accommodation for the evening.

DAYS 2-3 Chobe Game Drive and River Cruise (250km / 155mi, 4hrs drive)

Cross into Botswana and travel to the Chobe River, famous for its beautiful scenery, magnificent sunsets and abundance of wildlife and birdlife. Chobe National Park supports one of Africa's largest concentrations of elephants across riverfront floodplains and woodland habitats. The following day includes a morning game drive and a sunset game-viewing cruise along the Chobe River. Both evenings are spent overlooking the river in one of southern Africa's most significant wildlife regions.

DAY 4 Arrive Okavango Delta (320km / 199mi, 5hrs drive)

Travel through Chobe National Park and continue into Namibia's Caprivi region before crossing into Botswana towards the Okavango Delta. Arrive at your lodge on the edge of the Okavango Delta surrounded by waterways, floodplains and wetland landscapes. The Okavango Delta is the world's largest inland delta and supports rich ecosystems within the Kalahari Basin. Spend the evening relaxing ahead of tomorrow's delta excursions.

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thoughtful travel

trip grading Adventure touring

Although there is no commitment to extended walking on this journey we nonetheless want to keep the 'accent on the active'. We therefore advise that any physical training you complete before undertaking the trip will be to good effect. Although our day walks are optional there is no shortage of advantages of packing as much into your time in Southern Africa as possible. Whether this includes climbing the sandunes in Namibia or taking part in the adventure activities at Victoria Falls, the fitter you are the more this will enhance your experience.

DAY 5 Mokoro Okavango Delta

Transfer by boat into the Nxamasire channels of the Okavango Delta for a full day exploring this unique wetland environment. Mokoro excursions, boat trips and nature walks on smaller islands provide opportunities to experience the delta's waterways and wildlife up close, subject to water levels. The Okavango Delta supports diverse birdlife and wildlife across one of Africa's most important inland ecosystems. Return to the lodge in the late afternoon after a full day in the delta.

DAY 6 Okavango River (430km / 267mi, 6hrs drive)

Depart the Okavango Delta and cross back into Namibia through the Caprivi Strip. Lush vegetation and riverine landscapes replace the drier environments of earlier days as you continue towards the Kavango River. The river flows from Angola through Namibia before feeding the Okavango Delta in Botswana. Spend the evening overlooking the river and surrounding floodplains from your lodge.

DAY 7 Game Drive Etosha National Park (220km / 137mi, 3hrs drive)

Travel to Etosha National Park, one of Africa's most important wildlife reserves. The park is dominated by a vast salt pan visible from space, while surrounding waterholes attract elephant, lion, giraffe, zebra, cheetah and numerous antelope species. In the afternoon, head into the park in open 4x4 vehicles for your first game drive through Etosha's diverse wildlife habitats.

DAY 8 Full Day Game Drive Etosha National Park (150km / 93mi)

Spend the day exploring Etosha National Park on an extended game drive through the eastern sector of the reserve. Travel across open plains, around waterholes and along the edge of the immense Etosha Pan while searching for wildlife throughout the park. Large herds of antelope and zebra are commonly seen alongside predators and birdlife across this diverse ecosystem. Return to your lodge in the late afternoon after a full day of wildlife viewing.

DAY 9 Discover Damaraland (380km / 236mi, 7hrs)

Travel through the rugged landscapes of Damaraland, one of Namibia's most scenic regions. Mountain ranges, wide gravel plains, dry riverbeds and rocky gorges define this remote wilderness environment. Keep watch for elusive desert-adapted

DAYS 10-11 Explore Swakopmund (380km / 236mi, 5hrs drive)

Travel south through the rugged landscapes of Damaraland towards Namibia's Atlantic coastline. Arrive in Swakopmund and spend time exploring this German colonial town known for its historic architecture, wide streets and coastal setting. The following day is free for independent exploration or optional activities including dolphin cruises and Sandwich Harbour excursions at your own expense. Both evenings are spent in Swakopmund, where desert landscapes meet the Atlantic coastline.

DAYS 12-13 Walk Sesriem and Sossusvlei (520km / 323mi, 7hrs drive)

Travel south through changing desert landscapes towards accommodation on the edge of the Namib Desert. An early departure the following morning takes you into the dune belt at Sossusvlei where shifting light changes the colour of the towering dunes and clay pans of Deadvlei. A 5km walk explores Sossusvlei and Deadvlei before continuing to Sesriem Canyon for a short afternoon hike. The two days conclude back at camp surrounded by the desert landscapes of the Namib region.

DAY 14 Windhoek (approx 370 kms/6 hrs drive)

Depart Sesriem after breakfast and travel north through Namibia's changing desert landscapes towards Windhoek. Namibia's capital city combines German colonial architecture with modern African culture and remains the administrative centre of the country. The afternoon is free to explore the city's historic buildings, open public spaces and local cafés. Spend your final evening in Windhoek ahead of tomorrow's departure.

country information

Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe is in south-central Africa, between the Limpopo and the mighty Zambezi Rivers (home of the famous Victoria Falls). It is a landlocked country that boasts varied landscapes; from granite hills, green and fertile plains, high moorlands and craggy, forest-topped mountains to rolling savannah. In spite of an improving political situation, Zimbabwe continues to make headlines for all the wrong reasons. A power-sharing government headed by Robert Mugabe and Movement for Democratic Change (MDC) leader, Morgan Tsvangirai has pledged to improve the lives of Zimbabweans. Even though the economy is improving, many are still dependent on food aid. Behind the grim data lies one of southern Africa's most beautiful countries. And despite being forced to sacrifice so much, Zimbabweans have not lost their humour or resolve. With so few visiting the country, those who do can expect royal treatment. Visitors will see a very different image of the country. From absolute wilderness to the ancient ruins of Great Zimbabwe to fine dining in Harare or enjoying the activities of Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe offers something for everyone. A country of charm, political intrigue and magnificent wilderness awaits.

Botswana

Botswana in the centre of Southern Africa, is almost 582,000 sq. kms in area and is largely arid and semi arid, plains, pans and deserts. The Okavango Delta, is a rich and diverse habitat where the Okavango River drains into the sands of the Kalahari Desert. Formerly known as Bechuanaland, the former British protectorate gained independence in 1966. Shortly after independence, the discovery of 3 of the world's richest diamond deposits helped in economic development of this stable and democratic African nation. Botswana is considered an African success story, with strong democratic institutions, little corruption, freedom of speech and sustained economic growth. With a population of more than 1.5 million, including many different tribal groups, the majority of people are Tswana, while other groups include the Herero, Mbukushu, Yei, San, Kalanga and Kgalagadi.

Namibia

On the South West Africa Coast, sandwiched between the Kalahari Desert and the wild South Atlantic, Namibia has deserts, and dunes as well as coasts and canyons. Formerly a colony of Germany and later a colony of South Africa, the now independent Namibia is rich in natural resources and enjoys modern infrastructure and diverse traditional cultures.

climate

Southern Africa experiences a generally dry climate. There is a "summer" rainy season from November to March. The dry season from April to October includes the winter, when rain is rare and the nights can be very cold. Days are usually clear, warm and sunny and nights can get frosty in June and July.

a typical day

This trip involves some long driving days which will require early starts. Roads can be dusty and bumpy however we travel in custom built expedition vehicles which make our journeys as comfortable as possible.

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dietary requirements

Provided we are advised in advance of your departure we are able to cater for vegetarian diets and can assist with medically recommended diets (allergies and intolerances). Please ensure you discuss your requirements with us well in advance (at least 1 month prior to your trip) to determine whether we can cater to such dietary requirements on your chosen adventure. Please note that options are likely to be limited in very remote locations or alternatives may be more expensive or unavailable. There may be times when those with special requirements may need to provide their own food. We are unable to guarantee a peanut-free or allergen-free trip, and therefore, we strongly encourage that travellers with life-threatening or severe allergies take all necessary medical precautions to prepare for the possibility of exposure. Passengers must travel with all necessary medications for food allergies and be capable of self-administering these medications.

accommodation on the trip



All accommodation for this tour is in 3 to 4 star comfortable safari lodges and permanent tented camps full of character, based on twin share rooms with private ensuite facilities.

Note that a single supplement is compulsory for this trip if you are travelling alone. If you prefer to share, please advise us at time of booking and we will try to match you with another person of the same gender and also willing to share. This is rarely possible but if a match does happen we will be able to refund the single supplement approx 4 weeks prior to departure.

pre and post tour accommodation

Pre / Post Accommodation & Transfers may be pre-booked for Victoria Falls & Windhoek.

what you carry

In your daypack you will need to carry extra warm clothing (it can be very cold on early morning activities), a rainjacket, water bottle, camera gear, valuables and personal items such as sunscreen, lip balm etc.

equipment required

Specialist gear required include walking boots or shoes and a day pack (a comprehensive gear list is provided in the pre-departure information provided on booking).

non exclusive trips

Please note that this trip is not exclusive to World Expeditions clients and is operated by our partners in Southern Africa. Your participation and involvement is an integral part of an enjoyable and successful journey. Groups are pleasantly informal and are aimed at healthy, active participants looking for an adventurous holiday. You will be joining a group with a mix of participants from different countries and other group participants therefore may not speak English. The groups travel in custom built safari vehicles.

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wildlife

The wilderness areas of Africa are populated by large numbers of wild and potentially dangerous animals. The trip aims to view these animals in their natural habitat, uncontrolled by fences. Your experienced guides will make every effort to ensure the safety of the group at all times. Please be aware that all safari travel, including vehicle safaris in the proximity of wild animals is never entirely without risk. By travelling into wild areas in search of wild animals, all participants accept that they are choosing an adventure that includes an element of risk and this is an inherent aspect of the enjoyment of this style of travel.

chobe national park

Chobe National Park, in Botswana's northwest, was the country's first official national park. Its original inhabitants were the San bushmen, a nomadic people who moved constantly in search of food. Original San paintings can still be found inside rocky hills of the park. The park is best known for its number of Kalahari elephants, over 50,000, which is Africa's largest concentration. Lion, hyena, antelope, wildebeest, warthog, hippopotamus and zebras are also commonly visible. The area's bird life is also prolific with more than 450 species recorded in the park.

okavango delta

The Okavango Delta is the world's largest inland Delta. Today, the Okavango River has no outlet to the sea but instead empties onto the sands of the Kalahari Desert. The Okavango is home to an abundance of wildlife and attracts thousands of visitors each year. Elephants, buffalo, hippopotamus, wildebeest, giraffe, lion, cheetah, and leopard can all be found here. The park is also home to hyena, kudu, antelope, and both black and white rhinoceroses. The delta also includes over 400 species of birds, including the African Fish Eagle, the Crested Crane, the Lilac-breasted Roller, and the Sacred Ibis.

vehicles & safety

During the course of your trip, we will use a variety of vehicles, all of which are fit for purpose and the conditions encountered. It should be noted that laws governing transportation safety may differ from those in your home country and whilst wherever possible, vehicles with seatbelts are provided, on occasion some vehicles may not have seat belts fitted.

visas

Zimbabwe

You will need to complete an Online Declaration before arrival into Zimbabwe: <https://evisa.gov.zw/app/index.html#/home>

Visas are required for Zimbabwe for all the following nationalities and can be obtained at the border/ on arrival. These visa fees are payable (in cash only) on arrival at port of entry and are subject to change without notice:

United States of America US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

United Kingdom US\$ 55 single entry; US\$ 70 double entry

Canada US\$ 75 single entry only; double entry not available

Australia US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

New Zealand US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

A common tourist visa was recently introduced for Zambia and Zimbabwe known as the (KAZA) UNIVISA. The US\$50 Univisa (recommend to pay in cash) is valid for 30 days and allows the bearer to enter both Zambia and Zimbabwe. So if you think you will cross into Zambia even for a short period from Zimbabwe (eg. to look at Victoria Falls from that side), then it is better to purchase the

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Univisa. Full details including ports of entry issuing the Univisa, the eligible countries and more are available here: <https://www.zambiaimmigration.gov.zm/kaza-univisa/>

Keep in mind that if you are visiting Botswana for longer than a day trip, you will need to get a single entry visa (for Zambia or Zimbabwe depending on where you land) or a Univisa (if you plan to visit both Zambia and Zimbabwe), then visit Botswana and on return, will need to purchase another single entry visa or Univisa. In other words – if you have a Univisa but leave the joint Zambia/Zimbabwe area, you will have to buy a new visa on re-arrival.

All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

Visa requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or reservations consultant.

Botswana

Visas for Botswana are exempt for passport holders from the following countries:-

Australia

New Zealand

Canada

United States

United Kingdom

All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

Regulations have been implemented for people travelling with children to/from Botswana.

Anyone who is a minor (less than 18 years) must produce an original birth certificate in addition to a valid passport. If the child is not travelling with both parents named on their birth certificate a statutory declaration or affidavit made by the parent/s who are not accompanying the child, declaring that they give consent for the accompanying adult/s to travel with the child. This should be done and signed before a Justice of Peace. If the new requirements are not met, then boarding can be denied by any airline flying to/from Botswana, or travellers may be turned back at the border. If this applies to you, please make enquiries with your respective Botswana consulate/mission to confirm, as the conditions frequently change. We can assist with contact details of the relevant authorities if required.

Namibia

A visa is now required for most nationalities. Please ensure you get this beforehand as it is not possible to get at most border posts. You will need to apply for a Visa On Arrival (VOA) Online Application - NOT a Holiday visa. This automatically gives you a multiple entry visa, and valid for 90 days from the date of issue. Fees apply. Below is the link for the online VOA applications: <https://eservices.mhaiss.gov.na/visaonarrival>

The VOA Online Application must be completed electronically before arrival into Namibia. The visa costs NAD 1,600 (approximately USD90) for citizens from non-African countries (fees are subject to an annual review).

To apply for the visa you will require the below documentation:

For Visa on Arrival (VOA) Online applications: A valid passport with 6 months validity and 3 blank pages. Accurately completed Online Visa Application Form. Approved and printed E-visa Permit.

Travellers arriving in Namibia with Visa on Arrival online approval must ensure that they are prepared to present CONFIRMATION of any visa requirements as per online application completed, upon entry if requested by Immigration.

Regulations are in place for people travelling with children to/from Namibia. Anyone who is a minor (less than 18 years) must produce a certified copy of their unabridged (original) birth certificate in addition to a valid passport.

If the child is not travelling with both parents named on their birth certificate a statutory declaration or affidavit must be given by the parent/s or legal guardian/s who are not

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accompanying the child, declaring that they give consent for the accompanying adult/s or legal guardian/s to travel with the child. This should be done and signed before a Justice of Peace. Other additional documents may also be required; for example – death certificate (if one parent is deceased); copies of their parents'/legal guardians' passports or identity documents; contact details of the minor's parents/legal guardians. If the new requirements are not met, then boarding can be denied by any airline flying to/from Namibia, or travellers may be turned back at the border. If this applies to you, please make enquiries with your respective Namibia consulate/mission to confirm, as the conditions frequently change. We can assist with contact details of the relevant authorities if required.

In-person Visa on Arrival applications require: A valid passport with 6 months validity and 3 blank pages. Completed Visa on Arrival Application Form. Invitation letter (if required, note not needed for tourism purposes). Confirmation of accommodation and travel bookings/plans. Confirmation of Medical/Travel Insurance. Full birth certificate and parental consent letter if travelling with children.

Follow these steps to apply online for your visa:

- 1: Open the MHAISS website: <https://eservices.mhaiss.gov.na>
- 2: Choose Visa on Arrival, register and select country of origin
- 3: Complete ALL the required details
- 4: If accepted proceed and Submit Payment
- 5: Print your E-Visa Permit for presentation in Namibia
- 6: Complete the New Namibia Arrival Form (to be signed at the Immigration counter in presence of official).

Please bear in mind that visas may be required for countries you are visiting en route or transiting through on the way to your destination. It is important that you check the requirements of all countries you will visit. Visa costs and requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or World Expeditions reservations consultant. It is your responsibility to obtain all necessary visas.
