## the trip

The countries that lie at the southern end of the African continent evoke a strong spirit of the wild. From the seemingly empty and endless dunes of the Namibian desert to the teeming animal life of Etosha National Park, this itinerary traverses the greatest parks, reserves and landscapes that the south has to offer. Beginning in Victoria Falls Zimbabwe we head into Botswana for unforgettable wildlife encounters in two of Africa's greatest sanctuaries along the Chobe River and in the wondrous Okavango Delta. Passing into Namibia, we observe wildlife in Etosha National Park, marvel at the Sossusvlei sand dunes, explore the dramatic landscapes of the Namib Desert, and marvel at the enormity of Fish River Canyon. The city of Cape Town with Table Mountain as its backdrop, is a fitting end to this amazing adventure through Southern Africa.

## detailed itinerary

### DAY 1 Arrive Victoria Falls

The tour starts at 18:00hrs on Day 1 with a pre departure meeting in the hotel reception. On the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe, the Victoria Falls or "Mosi-oa-Tunya" (Smoke that Thunders), are one of the most enthralling sights in Africa. The remainder of the afternoon is at leisure to explore the Falls or take part in some of the many optional activities on offer in the adrenalin capital of Africa. Overnight Sprayview Lodge (or similar).

### DAYS 2-3 Chobe River (approx 90 kms/3 hrs drive)

The following day is free to browse the local markets, to experience the many optional activities on offer including white water rafting, bungi jumping, microlighting/ airplane or helicopter flights over the Falls and to visit the Falls (own expense). Mid afternoon we cross into Botswana where we overnight on the banks of the Chobe River. Chobe is famous for its beautiful scenery, magnificent sunsets and abundance of wildlife and birdlife. On our second day in the area we begin with a morning game drive. Our final evening here we relax on a sunset game viewing cruise on the Chobe River.

### DAYS 4-5 Okavango Delta (approx 310 kms/6 hrs drive)

Continuing into the Caprivi we cross into Botswana and travel by road to our campsite on the edge of the Okavango Delta. The following day we do mokoro and boat excursions in the back channels of the Nxamasire area of the Delta. Game walks are also done on the smaller islands in the area subject to water levels of the delta.

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## thoughtful travel

## trip grading Adventure touring

Although there is no commitment to extended walking on this journey we nonetheless want to keep the 'accent on the active'. We therefore advise that any physical training you complete before undertaking the trip will be to good effect. Although our day walks are optional there is no shortage of advantages of packing as much into your time in Southern Africa as possible. Whether this includes climbing the sandunes in Namibia or taking part in the adventure activities at Victoria Falls, the fitter you are the more this will enhance your experience. Active participation in camp set up and some chores are encouraged for this trip.

### DAY 6 Kavango River - Rundu (approx 300 kms/5 hrs drive)

Departing the Delta by boat we return to our vehicle and we cross back into Namibia. We enter the Caprivi Strip and travel to Rundu where camp is set amongst the lush vegetation overlooking the Kavango River.

### DAYS 7-8 Etosha National Park (approx 420 kms/6 hrs drive)

We enter Etosha and travel through the park. Etosha National Park is one of the most important reserves and game sanctuaries in Africa with thousands of wild animals such as blue wildebeest, springbok, zebra, kudu, giraffe, cheetah, leopard, lion and elephant making this area their home. Floodlit waterholes at Okakeujo and Namutoni campsite attracts an abundance of animals throughout the evening, providing us with many amazing wildlife sightings. We enjoy early morning and late afternoon game drives, relaxing in the middle of the day when wildlife is least active (approx 150 kms drive/12 hrs including lunch).

### DAY 9 Spitzkoppe (approx 530 kms - 250 kms tarmac & 280 kms gravel/9 hrs drive)

We drive inland through the Damaraland region with its vast and rugged terrain. Its mountain ranges are intercepted by wide gravel plains, which run into sandy, vegetated riverbeds and hot, dry valleys. We set up camp among the boulders of the Spitzkoppe Mountains. An afternoon walk is conducted in the surrounding area provides opportunity to stretch our legs and explore. The spectacular setting of our remote bushcamp is sure to leave a lasting impression.

We arrive in Swakopmund and spend the afternoon exploring this German colonial town with its tree-lined boulevard and shops and cafes. There are many local restaurants where you can find dinner. Overnight in guesthouse.

### DAYS 11-12 Sesriem and Sossusvlei (approx 380 kms/6 hrs drive)

Our journey takes us south through ever changing scenery to our camp located on the edge of the Namib Desert. The following morning is an early departure for Sossusvlei, stopping in the dune belt along the way to witness the changing colours

of the world's highest sand dunes as the sun strikes them - an absolutely magnificent moment. We undertake a 5km walk to Sossusvlei and Deadvlei - starkly beautiful in a harsh environment. In the afternoon we enjoy a short hike through Sesriem Canyon, a natural canyon about 1km long and 30 metres deep in places.

### DAY 13 Fish River Canyon (approx 520 kms/8 hrs drive)

Today we leave the sand dunes and travel south through Namibia to the Fish River Canyon. After setting up camp we have time to enjoy a walk along the rim of the canyon and watch the glorious hues of sunset over the canyon. Second only to the Grand Canyon in size, Fish River Canyon is a truly awe-inspiring work of nature.

### DAYS 14-15 Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park (approx 470 kms/6 hrs drive)

We travel into the heart of the Kalahari and the magnificent Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park. Covering over 3.6 million hectares this is one of the largest reserves in Africa. Due to sparse vegetation in the area excellent predator sightings are common including that of the famous black mane Lion. Afternoon of arrival we partake in a 2 hour walk where you are accompanied by a qualified field guide and possibly our family of meerkats. You will learn about the geology of the area as well as the animals and plants of the Kalahari dunes. The tour begins approximately 2-3 hours before sunset. An introduction to the dune life from the insects to the large mammals, including the tracks of many that are rarely seen because they are not active during the daytime. The guide will interpret the tracks of those that have been active during the night. This popular tour will open the visitor's eyes to the amazing variety of creatures that call the seemingly "barren" dunes their home.

On Day 15 we enter the park for a full day game drive in our truck vehicle.

### DAY 16 Augrabies Falls National Park (approx 360 kms/5 hrs drive)

We pass through a lush oasis area with an abundance of wine farms on our way to Augrabies Falls National Park where the mighty Orange River plummets 56m into the gorge below. The local name for these majestic falls is 'Aukoerebis' or 'place of great noise'. We spend the afternoon enjoying the falls from its many viewpoints.

### DAY 17 Namaqualand (approx 600 kms/8 hrs drive)

Departing Augrabies we arrive in our campsite in the picturesque Namaqualand region. During the months of August - October the landscape is transformed into an explosion of colour due to the numerous wild flowers of the region.

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## DAY 18 To Cape Town (approx 360 kms/5 hrs drive)

Travelling through the Namaqualand region we arrive in Cape Town mid afternoon. Set against the majestic Table Mountain, Cape Town offers scenic, historic and cultural attractions. Dinner can be enjoyed at the bustling Waterfront (own expense). Overnight Breakwater Lodge (or similar accommodation).

## DAY 19 Cape Town and Peninsula

Set against the majestic Table Mountain, Cape Town offers scenic, historic and cultural attractions. Depart from Breakwater Lodge at 08:00am, for a peninsula tour. Driving along the Atlantic seaboard via Hout Bay and Chapman's Peak, we visit the Table Mountain National Park – Cape Point, returning along the Indian Ocean coastline back to our well situated Waterfront hotel. A morning or afternoon cable car ascent up Table Mountain is optional (own expense). Lunch and dinner today can be enjoyed at the bustling Waterfront at your own expense. Overnight Breakwater Lodge (or similar accommodation).

## country information

### Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe is in south-central Africa, between the Limpopo and the mighty Zambezi Rivers (home of the famous Victoria Falls). It is a landlocked country that boasts varied landscapes; from granite hills, green and fertile plains, high moorlands and craggy, forest-topped mountains to rolling savannah. Zimbabwe has three languages: Shona, Ndebele and English and approx. 70% of the population speaks Shona as their first language. Sport is an important part of Zimbabwe culture; football (soccer) is by far the most popular sport.

### Botswana

Botswana in the centre of Southern Africa, is almost 582,000 sq. kms in area and is largely arid and semi arid, plains, pans and deserts. The Okavango Delta, is a rich and diverse habitat where the Okavango River drains into the sands of the Kalahari Desert. Formerly known as Bechuanaland, the former British protectorate gained independence in 1966. Shortly after independence, the discovery of 3 of the world's richest diamond deposits helped in economic development of this stable and democratic African nation. Botswana is considered an African success story, with strong democratic institutions, little corruption, freedom of speech and sustained economic growth. With a population of more than 1.5 million, including many different tribal groups, the majority of people are Tswana, while other groups include the Herero, Mbukushu, Yei, San, Kalanga and Kgalagadi.

### Namibia

On the South West Africa Coast, sandwiched between the Kalahari Desert and the wild South Atlantic, Namibia has deserts, and dunes as well as coasts and canyons. Formerly a colony of Germany and later a colony of South Africa, the now independent Namibia is rich in natural resources and enjoys modern infrastructure and diverse traditional cultures.

### South Africa

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South Africa is a huge and diverse nation covering the entire Southern Tip of the African continent. The Rainbow Nation is home to an incredible diversity of peoples who are working on forging a new future a decade after the fall of the Apartheid regime. The land is as diverse as the people, from the postcard perfection of Cape Town and the Table Mountain to the rugged splendour of the Orange River and the teeming metropolis of Johannesburg.

## climate

Southern Africa experiences a generally dry climate. There is a summer rainy season from November to March. The dry season from April to October includes the winter, when rain is rare and the nights can be very cold. Days are usually clear, warm and sunny and nights can get frosty in June and July.

## a typical day

This trip involves some long driving days which will require early starts. Roads can be dusty and bumpy however we travel in custom built expedition vehicles which make our journeys as comfortable as possible.

## dietary requirements

Provided we are advised in advance of your departure we are able to cater for vegetarian diets and can assist with medically recommended diets (allergies and intolerances). Please ensure you discuss your requirements with us well in advance (at least 1 month prior to your trip) to determine whether we can cater to such dietary requirements on your chosen adventure. Please note that options are likely to be limited in very remote locations or alternatives may be more expensive or unavailable. There may be times when those with special requirements may need to provide their own food. We are unable to guarantee a peanut-free or allergen-free trip, and therefore, we strongly encourage that travellers with life-threatening or severe allergies take all necessary medical precautions to prepare for the possibility of exposure. Passengers must travel with all necessary medications for food allergies and be capable of self-administering these medications.

## accommodation on the trip



We enjoy fully serviced camping on this trip, which means all camping gear (including sleeping bag & pillow), spacious 2 person safari tents, camp bed, mattress and comfortable safari folding chairs are all provided. We also enjoy the attention of two camp assistants/cooks who set everything up for us, in addition to our English-speaking guide.

Note that a single supplement is compulsory for this trip if you are travelling alone. If you prefer to share, please advise us at time of booking and we will try to match you with another person of the same gender and also willing to share. This is rarely possible but if a match does happen we will be able to refund the single supplement approx 4 weeks prior to departure.

## what you carry

In your daypack you will need to carry extra warm clothing (it can be very cold on early morning activities), a rainjacket, water bottle, camera gear, valuables and personal items such as sunscreen, lip balm etc.

## non exclusive trips

Please note that this trip is not exclusive to World Expeditions clients and is operated by our partners in Southern Africa. Groups are pleasantly informal, usually comprising a wide range of nationalities and are aimed at healthy, active participants looking for an adventurous holiday. Participants are not required to assist the crew with any camp chores. Three crew accompany every tour with the guide and assistants/ cooks taking care of all meals. The groups of maximum 16 (minimum 4) travel in custom built expedition vehicles.

## wildlife

The wilderness areas of Africa are populated by large numbers of wild and potentially dangerous animals. The trip aims to view these animals in their natural habitat, uncontrolled by fences. Your experienced guides will make every effort to ensure the safety of the group at all times. Please be aware that all safari travel, including vehicle safaris in the proximity of wild animals is never entirely without risk. By travelling into wild areas in search of wild animals, all participants accept that they are choosing an adventure that includes an element of risk and this is an inherent aspect of the enjoyment of this style of travel.

## chobe national park

Chobe National Park, in Botswana's northwest, was the country's first official national park. Its original inhabitants were the San bushmen, a nomadic people who moved constantly in search of food. Original San paintings can still be found inside rocky hills of the park. The park is best known for its number of Kalahari elephants, over 50,000, which is Africa's largest concentration. Lion, hyena, antelope, wildebeest, warthog, hippopotamus and zebras are also commonly visible. The area's bird life is also prolific with more than 450 species recorded in the park.

## okavango delta

The Okavango Delta is the world's largest inland Delta. Today, the Okavango River has no outlet to the sea but instead empties onto the sands of the Kalahari Desert. The Okavango is home to an abundance of wildlife and attracts thousands of visitors each year. Elephants, buffalo, hippopotamus, wildebeest, giraffe, lion, cheetah, and leopard can all be found here. The park is also home to hyena, kudu, antelope, and both black and white rhinoceroses. The delta also includes over 400 species of birds, including the African Fish Eagle, the Crested Crane, the Lilac-breasted Roller, and the Sacred Ibis.

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## vehicles & safety

During the course of your trip, we will use a variety of vehicles, all of which are fit for purpose and the conditions encountered. It should be noted that laws governing transportation safety may differ from those in your home country and whilst wherever possible, vehicles with seatbelts are provided, on occasion some vehicles may not have seat belts fitted.

### Zimbabwe

Visas are required for Zimbabwe for all the following nationalities and can be obtained at the border/ on arrival. These visa fees are payable (in cash only) on arrival at port of entry and are subject to change without notice:

United States of America US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

United Kingdom US\$ 55 single entry; US\$ 70 double entry

Canada US\$ 75 single entry only; double entry not available

Australia US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

New Zealand US\$ 30 single entry; US\$ 45 double entry

A common tourist visa was recently introduced for Zambia and Zimbabwe known as the (KAZA) UNIVISA. The US\$50 Univisa (recommend to pay in cash) is valid for 30 days and allows the bearer to enter both Zambia and Zimbabwe. So if you think you will cross into Zambia even for a short period from Zimbabwe (eg. to look at Victoria Falls from that side), then it is better to purchase the Univisa. Full details including ports of entry issuing the Univisa, the eligible countries and more are available here: <https://www.zambiaimmigration.gov.zm/kaza-univisa/>

Keep in mind that if you are visiting Botswana for longer than a day trip, you will need to get a single entry visa (for Zambia or Zimbabwe depending on where you land) or a Univisa (if you plan to visit both Zambia and Zimbabwe), then visit Botswana and on return, will need to purchase another single entry visa or Univisa. In other words – if you have a Univisa but leave the joint Zambia/Zimbabwe area, you will have to buy a new visa on re-arrival.

All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

Visa requirements do change regularly so we suggest you check with your travel agent or reservations consultant.

### Botswana

Visas for Botswana are exempt for passport holders from the following countries:-

Australia

New Zealand

Canada

United States

United Kingdom

All other nationalities should check with your nearest embassy or consulate.

Regulations have been implemented for people travelling with children to/from Botswana.

Anyone who is a minor (less than 18 years) must produce an original birth certificate in addition to a valid passport. If the child is not travelling with both parents named on their birth certificate a statutory declaration or affidavit made by the parent/s who are not accompanying the child, declaring that they give consent for the accompanying adult/s to travel with the child. This should be done and signed before a Justice of Peace. If the new requirements are not met, then boarding can be denied by any airline flying to/from Botswana, or travellers may be turned back at the

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border. If this applies to you, please make enquiries with your respective Botswana consulate/mission to confirm, as the conditions frequently change. We can assist with contact details of the relevant authorities if required.

## Namibia

A visa is now required for most nationalities. Please ensure you get this beforehand as it is not possible to get at most border posts. You will need to apply for a Visa On Arrival (VOA) Online Application - NOT a Holiday visa. This automatically gives you a multiple entry visa, and valid for 90 days from the date of issue. Fees apply. Below is the link for the online VOA applications: <https://eservices.mhaiss.gov.na/visaonarrival>

The VOA Online Application must be completed electronically before arrival into Namibia. The visa costs NAD 1,600 (approximately USD90) for citizens from non-African countries (fees are subject to an annual review).

To apply for the visa you will require the below documentation:

For Visa on Arrival (VOA) Online applications: A valid passport with 6 months validity and 3 blank pages. Accurately completed Online Visa Application Form. Approved and printed E-visa Permit.

Travellers arriving in Namibia with Visa on Arrival online approval must ensure that they are prepared to present CONFIRMATION of any visa requirements as per online application completed, upon entry if requested by Immigration.

Regulations are in place for people travelling with children to/from Namibia. Anyone who is a minor (less than 18 years) must produce a certified copy of their unabridged (original) birth certificate in addition to a valid passport.

If the child is not travelling with both parents named on their birth certificate a statutory declaration or affidavit must be given by the parent/s or legal guardian/s who are not accompanying the child, declaring that they give consent for the accompanying adult/s or legal guardian/s to travel with the child. This should be done and signed before a Justice of Peace. Other additional documents may also be required; for example – death certificate (if one parent is deceased); copies of their parents'/legal guardians' passports or identity documents; contact details of the minor's parents/legal guardians. If the new requirements are not met, then boarding can be denied by any airline flying to/from Namibia, or travellers may be turned back at the border. If this applies to you, please make enquiries with your respective Namibia consulate/mission to confirm, as the conditions frequently change. We can assist with contact details of the relevant authorities if required.

In-person Visa on Arrival applications require: A valid passport with 6 months validity and 3 blank pages. Completed Visa on Arrival Application Form. Invitation letter (if required, note not needed for tourism purposes). Confirmation of accommodation and travel bookings/plans. Confirmation of Medical/Travel Insurance. Full birth certificate and parental consent letter if travelling with children.

Follow these steps to apply online for your visa:

- 1: Open the MHAISS website: <https://eservices.mhaiss.gov.na>
- 2: Choose Visa on Arrival, register and select country of origin
- 3: Complete ALL the required details
- 4: If accepted proceed and Submit Payment
- 5: Print your E-Visa Permit for presentation in Namibia
- 6: Complete the New Namibia Arrival Form (to be signed at the Immigration counter in presence of official).

Visas for South Africa are exempt for a stay of less than 90 days for passport holders from the following countries:-
